All participants and visitors should plan to carpool or to vanpool as much as possible. Parking spaces will be limited to designated areas. Once vehicles are parked, they should remain parked for the duration of the weekend.

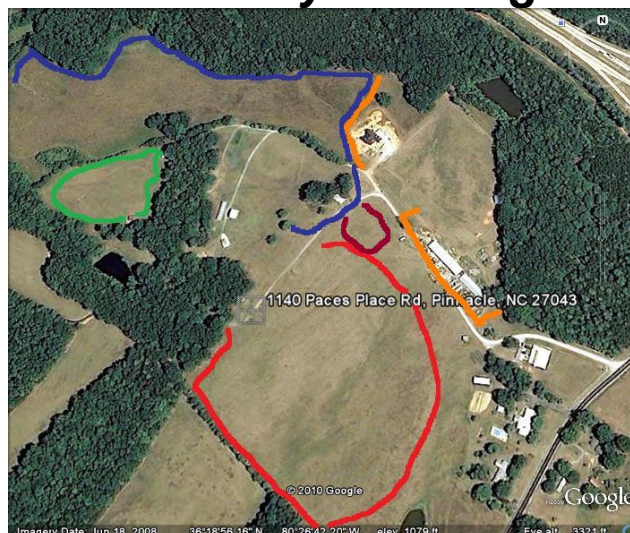

Directions to Jomeokee Park

From Winston-Salem:

- Take US-52 North toward Mt. Airy (22.4 miles)
- Take exit 129 (Pinnacle exit)
- Turn left onto Perch Rd, top of ramp (0.3 miles)
- Go over bridge, past gas station
- Take 1st right on Paces Place Rd (0.4 miles)

From Mount Airy:

- Take US-52 South toward Winston Salem
- Take Pinnacle exit (11.4 miles)
- Exit onto Perch Rd (0.2 miles)
- Turn right
- Take 1st right on Paces Place Rd (0.4 miles)

From Boone:

- Take US-421 South toward I-77 (52.5 miles)
- Take exit 265A to merge onto I-77 North toward Elkin (27.1 miles)
- Take exit 101 to merge onto I-74 East toward Winston Salem (12.2 miles)
- Take US 52 South to Pinnacle exit (11.4 miles)
- Take Pinnacle exit onto Perch Rd (0.2 miles)
- Take 1st right on Paces Place Rd (0.4 miles)

Exploring Campsite Description & Preliminary List of Activities

At Jomeokee Park:

Registration will be at the Staff Headquarters. Two (2) Adults judges and Two (2) Explorers from each post will need to come to register. If you plan to come on Fri., you can check-in then; but, you will need to check in on Sat. to confirm that no changes have been made. If you plan to camp please bring equipment for the weather, also food will be each Post's responsibility. Awards will be done at the camp fire.

Preliminary List of Activities:

Sites for morning Competition for Fire, EMS, and Law Enforcement will be determined based on participation.

Afternoon: When competitions are complete there will be show and tell for the Scouts and "meet and great" for explorers. Posts need to be ready to show what they can do for younger Scouts

Fire Dept: You will need full turnout gear, if you have it. There will be individual and team relay events. More information will be sent to Post Advisors after you confirm you are coming. Any teams that wish to compete in the EMS completion will need to register for the EMS side also.

EMS: This will be like the state competition. You will need to bring a basic EMS bag, O2 supplies and back board with straps. No advance airways or drugs will be used. Groups of two (2) will be competing (1 scenario and test). Tests will be based on the OEMS state first responder course and AHA CPR. Any teams that wish to participate in Fire Competition will need to register for fire side also.

Law Enforcement: This competition will only be open to Law Enforcement Explorers. You will need to bring duty belt holster and hand cuffs. There will be multiple events including 2 scenario ranging from traffic stops to domestic disputes and a modified POPAT. Further information will be sent upon reservation.
