The American Red Cross Wilderness First Aid Basics Course is a course for those who work, live or play in remote areas. Subjects include: Delayed-help situations, emergency action steps, checking scene, patient and resources, contacting help, long term care, patient assessment and record, preventing disease transmission, prioritizing care, treatment of injuries (wounds, head and spinal, extremity, abdominal), sudden illness, bites and stings, carrying out the plan and transports and evacuations.

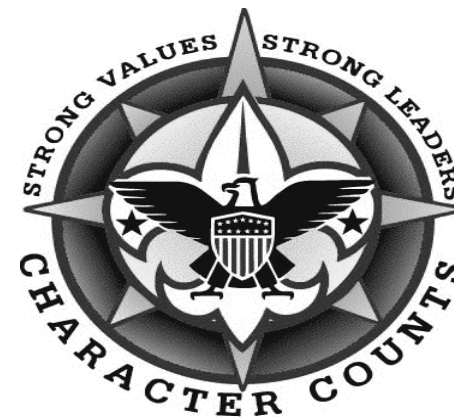

## "This is Scouting" & Cub Leader Specific



"This is Scouting" is an introductory session that highlights the values, aims, history, funding, and methods of Scouting. It addresses how these aims and methods are reached in an age-appropriate style within Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Varsity Scouting, and Venturing. Videos, discussions, and hands-on reinforcement are presented during the 90-minute training session. Ideally, all unit-based volunteers—Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, and Venturing leaders—take this session at the same time, so they understand that they are all striving for the same results with the youth they serve. Each leader completes This Is Scouting training only once. Leader Specific training has been developed for the following positions and their assistants: Tiger Cub den leaders, Cub Scout den leaders, Webelos den leaders, Cubmasters, and Pack committee members.

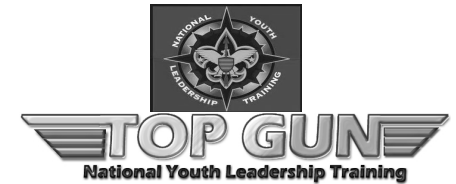

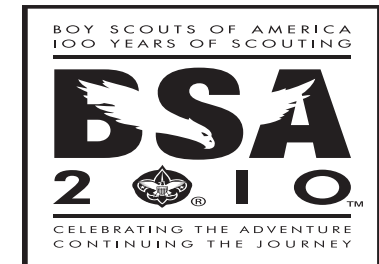
