Welcome to the 2011 Piedmont District Fall Camporee! The Camporee theme this year is **"Honoring America's Military Veterans."** The program will include patrol competitions, activities, demonstrations and displays used by our military. The Camporee will be located on the grounds and airstrip of Smith-Reynolds Airport.

Boy Scouts and Venture Scouts should review and practice their Scouting skills in preparation for the Camporee competitions.

- The Camporee will be open to visitors that would like to come on Saturday, Oct 22nd

On the airport ramp side of the camporee, there will be military and aviation exhibits as well as patrol competitions. Each scout must have an activity consent form completed and signed by a parent. Airplane rides will be offered on a lottery basis, see activities in this guide. Parents must be informed and give permission, by signing the consent form, for their son if he is selected for the flight.

General Information

1. For registration, forms can be faxed to the Old Hickory Council Office at 336-760-4222. Go to oldhickorycouncil.org to register online.
2. Please be considerate and use raised fire pits. Please practice leave-no-trace fire building techniques to minimize the damage to the site.
3. A water buffalo will be available. Units should bring containers for transporting water. Port-a-Jons will be available.

4. EACH Scout has to have the attached activity consent form completed and signed by a parent.

5. **Parking will be in designated areas only.** You will be permitted to park your vehicle near the camping area to unload and load equipment.
6. Leaders should have current medical forms for all members of the troop that are attending the Camporee.
7. **Any areas that are fenced-in or marked with yellow tape are off-limits.** It is the responsibility of all adult leaders present to inform the Scouts of this requirement and to ensure their compliance with this rule.

8. The Camporee staff requests that no troop leave the Camporee before their campsite has been inspected by a member of the Camporee staff.

9. Please practice low or minimum impact camping and bring your own wood and poles for campsite projects as needed.
10. All trash, debris, used material, etc. must be removed from the campsite when you leave.
11. Class A uniforms are required for the flag ceremony, campfire program and interfaith worship service. Class B uniforms are permitted for the rest of the weekend.
12. Be prepared for rain and/or cold and dress accordingly.
13. **Visitors:** This event is a **Boy Scout** and **Venture Scout** event; all activities are for Boy Scouts/Venture Scouts **only**. Visitors may come to observe, but they may not participate.
14. The Camporee site will be available on Friday, October 21st after 4 pm. Just follow the map to the campsite off of North Liberty Street. Signs will be posted to point all units in the right direction.

15. This is a PATROL COMPETITION EVENT. Your patrols MUST prepare before the camporee for many of the events. On the airport ramp side of the camporee, there will be military and aviation exhibits as well as patrol competitions.

Piedmont District Fall Camporee Patrol Competition

Location: Campground

All events will be inter-patrol competitions that relate to military training. We encourage units to plan their meetings around preparation for the events and so doing build excitement about the coming camporee. All events will require team work and problem solving. Points will be awarded and trophies presented to the patrols based on total scoring.

Extra Points:

Patrol spirit: Extra points can be earned by any patrol displaying GREAT patrol spirit and the sounds-off with a loud and thunderous patrol call upon request by the station judge. Exhibiting this spirit throughout the camporee will be noted by judges. All spirit to be in keeping with the Scout Oath and Law. **Points: 20**

Uniforming: Class A uniform worn by patrol members throughout the day on Saturday. **Points: 100% in uniform 10 Points , 50% in uniform 8 points, <than 50% in uniform 5 points.**

Veteran Hunt: Patrol finds veterans and asks his/her name, branch of service and service dates. **Points : 1 point per veteran found**

BST Stations (Basic Scout Training)

Station Alpha: Land Navigation

At this station each patrol will demonstrate their ability to follow a compass bearing (azimuth) and use their pace count to accurately estimate the length of each leg (4) of the course. Each leg 50-100 meters long with a starting and ending stake with a marked starting point and marked ending point. Ending stake not easily seen from a distance. For point credit, end each leg within 20ft of that leg end point.

Points: 5 points for each leg completed, 20 total.

Station Bravo: Emergency First Aid

Patrols will be told by the grader what injuries the victim has. Patrol must be prepared to render correct first aid for one or more of the five areas below:

1. Sprained or broken leg or arm
2. Hypothermia either weather induced or immersion hypothermia
3. Heat injuries (heat exhaustion or heat stroke)
4. Arterial bleeding and treat for shock
5. CPR/rescue breathing

Points: 20

Station Charlie: Camporee Physical Fitness Test (CPFT)

Each patrol will undergo a simulated Army Physical Fitness Test (APFT) consisting of Pushups (30 seconds), Bent leg Sit-ups (30 seconds) and 10 meter Inverted Crawl (aka crab crawl).

Object is for every member of the patrol is to complete as many exercises as possible within time permitted.

Points: Situps- 1 for each situp (30 max), Pushup- 1 for each pushup (30max), Inverted Crawl-travel 20 total meters in 20 seconds (40 max)

Station Delta: Obstacle Course

This event consists of a race against the clock to negotiate the following obstacles as quickly as possible:

- a. **Low Crawl Pit:** Simulated barbed wire approximately 12 inches off the ground. "Pit" is 6 feet wide and 30 feet long. "Wire" is paracord. Each patrol member must crawl face up, the length of the pit without touching the "wire". Touch the "wire" start over. Patrol members may push or pull each other only from the ends of the "pit".
- b. **"Hand Grenade" Throw:** Lob 5 baseballs ("hand grenades") into a circle outlined on the ground 5 meters in diameter. To count the "grenade" must come to rest inside the circle.
- c. **Rope Swing Over the Trench of Doom:** Swinging Rope is on the near side of the "trench". The "trench" consists of two parallel lines 20 feet long and 10 feet apart. Each patrol member must use the rope to swing across and clear the "trench". The patrol continues when all members are clear.
- d. **Cross a One Rope Bridge:** Each member of the patrol must cross a previously constructed one rope bridge spanning approximately 30 feet without touching the "water". Use a static climbing rope pulled VERY tight. Bridge should be set up by the graders prior to the start of the competition. Rope should be no more than 4 feet off the ground.
- e. **Rescue the "wounded" patrol member:** the patrol will be given 2 poles and 2 army ponchos or strong blankets with which to construct an improvised litter. Next the patrol leader or whoever is obviously in charge will be designated as "wounded" and cannot walk or be treated roughly. The object is to construct the litter, place the "wounded" patrol member on the litter and carry him 100 feet.

Points: 100 total for completion, Placing 1st, 2nd, 3rd in each event earns extra points.

Piedmont District Fall Camporee Patrol Competition

Location: Airport Ramp

Station: Golf

One or more scouts from each troop (depending on numbers and availability of planes) will be given an opportunity to take a 10 minute+ flight in a light aircraft. Each scout participating MUST have a completed BSA FLYING PLAN APPLICATION form turned in with registration forms. A drawing from completed forms will be held by the camporee staff for each troop to determine which scout will fly. **NO POINTS**

Station: Hotel

Tire change competition. Each patrol must change the tire of a Willy's military jeep using the tools provided. A brief period of instruction will be given and then the patrol will change the tire and be timed. **POINTS: 25**

Station: India

Assembling a rope bridge. The hand lines, foot lines and stringer lines will be given to the patrol. The patrol will review the directions for assembly. Grading will be on time and correctness of knots. **POINTS: 20**

Station: Juliet

Tire roll. Each patrol member must roll a tire and rim through a three pylon slalom course and back in a relay. This is a timed event. **POINTS: 20**

Station: Kilo

A scout has a broken leg. The leg must be splinted and the scout safely transported to and placed in an evacuation vehicle via a stretcher. Grading will be on correctness of splint and safety of the transport. **POINTS: 25**

Station: Lima

The patrol must move an ammo crate from a remote location and successfully load it onto a vehicle. Grading is on time and safety. **POINTS: 10**
