This event is open to all registered Tiger Cubs, Cub Scouts, and Webelos. New for 2022, Fall Adventure Weekends will welcome the entire family. Our goal is to provide a fun and safe weekend where Cubs and families/guardians can enjoy Camp Raven Knob through a fun-filled day of events and two nights of camping with their fellow Scouts!

Lion Cubs ARE going to be allowed to come to the Fall Adventure Weekends this year.

Eligibility:

This event is for registered Cub Scouts, Parents, and Leaders. Also, family members who are not registered, grandparents, other family members, and siblings are welcome to attend. Anyone over the age of 18 years old must have completed Youth Protection Training at my.scouting.org.

Costs:

There are two different costs for Fall Adventure Weekends, each pack can have the options of cooking in their campsites or having their meals provided in the dining hall. Meals provided in the dining hall will be limited to 400 people.

\$25.00 (Includes bag lunch on Saturday for all participants). This fee covers: Saturday lunch, t-shirt, patch, insurance, program materials, craft materials, and other applicable costs.

\$35.00 (Includes bag lunch on Saturday for all participants). This fee covers: Saturday breakfast, lunch, & dinner, and Sunday breakfast. Also included is a t-shirt, patch, insurance, program materials, craft materials, and other applicable costs.

****There are no special diet meals available at Fall Adventure Weekends. If you have a scout or parent that requires special meals, the must provide them. They will not be provided by the camp.****

Registration Process and Deadlines:

Online (only) registration begins on August 15th

Deadline dates for registration: September 26th, 2022 – Weekend #1
October 10th, 2022 – Weekend #2

You will need to complete the online registration and pay by debit/credit card or e-check.

Each Pack should designate one adult leader to handle all the details for the entire Pack. Individuals will not be able to register on their own.

*** Please note that you must enter every attendee's name (Pack Roster) on the website when you register. ***

Late Registrations:

If anyone registers late, they will incur a \$10.00 late fee (the only exception that will be made is for new scouts). T-shirts or patches **MAY NOT** be given or guaranteed to late registrations until they have been given to those who registered on time.

Scout/Leader Ratio:

Please note – Packs with female cubs must have at least 1 BSA registered adult female in attendance at all times during the weekend.

The Cub to Leader ratio is:

- One Lion to one parent
- One Cub to one parent for Tiger Cub Scouts
(At least one parent/guardian should attend with their respective Tiger Cub).
- One Leader for every 3 Cubs (Wolf and Bear Scouts)
- One Leader for every 5 Cubs (Webelos Scouts)

Packs must provide at least two Registered Adult Leaders for each Pack (two-deep Leadership) and must have Registered Female Leaders if they bring female cubs. Den Chiefs should be included on your registration form; However they are not considered Adult Leaders and must not count toward the leader to scout ratio. In registering Cub Scouts, the Pack must follow the cub to adult ratio. The parents must abide by the same council rules and guidelines as if they were adult leaders. Parents are, for the purposes of this event only, considered a leader whether or not they are registered with the BSA. Therefore, any adult attending that is serving as a leader for the weekend, must be approved by the Pack Leadership and is required to take the BSA Youth Protection Training.

Campsites: Campsites will be assigned (based on # of campers, special needs, etc.) one week prior to your scheduled weekend. Since Adirondacks are limited, please be prepared to tent camp if assigned to a site that does not have Adirondacks. Packs that will be bringing boy and girl cub scouts will need to be prepared to provide tents (even in Adirondack sites) due to limited space and Youth Protection requirements.

Note: In tent sites, stacked platforms from summer camp are NOT to be used.

Check-In:

Check-in will be at the Maintenance Facility from 5pm to 8:30pm on Friday night the **Designated Adult Pack Leader must check-in for their entire unit.**

To expedite the check-in process Cubmasters are required to bring the following items with them to check-in:

- ✓ Registration paperwork (Roster).
- ✓ At least one additional leader for assistance.
- ✓ Invoice and Payment receipts.
- ✓ Exact number and sizes of shirts needed.
- ✓ Any unpaid fees for add on scouts.

Program activities begin Saturday at 9:30am. If your Pack cannot arrive within the designated hours, please contact a Parent-Cub Directors (listed below) to make special arrangements.

Check-Out:

On Sunday morning, Packs are responsible for picking up all trash and cleaning the latrines in their respective campsites (Leave No Trace). Trash bags and recycle bins will be provided and should be left at the road for pick-up by the Parent-Cub Weekend Staff. *Patches will be available at the Administration Building as the Pack is leaving camp/checking out.*

Note: Packs leaving on Saturday evening must notify the Parent-Cub Director by 2 pm on Saturday in order to receive patches after campfire. He can be found at Scout Craft from 2 -4 pm on Saturday.

Staff: Staffing for this event will include registered adult volunteers, Order of the Arrow youth, and Scoutmaster approved Scouts age 13 and older.

Rules of the Land at Camp Raven Knob: **Carpooling is a Wonderful thing!!!**

- **No driving in camp and park only in designated parking areas.** We have a lot of children at camp and driving is *EXTREMELY DANGEROUS*. Anyone physically impaired must request a special pass that they put in their car that allows them to drive at camp. **Parking in the Campsite is NOT DESIGNATED PARKING.**
- **If you must drive, and have a driving permit, the Camp Speed Limit is 5mph.**
- No alcoholic drinks of any kind are permitted.
- Camp Raven Knob is a non-smoking camp. While it is not recommended, if you find that you must smoke please go to an isolated location and remember to field strip cigarettes and dispose of the remaining filter in the trash. **Keep in mind that you cannot smoke in shelters or in front of Scouts.**
- No rifles, firearms, bows, bb guns, fireworks, explosives, nor ammunition are allowed.
- No pets are allowed in camp. The only exception is a service dog.
- Closed toe and closed heel shoes should be worn at all times. *Tennis shoes and hiking boots are recommended.*
- No running in camp.
- Rocks and sticks should not be thrown.
- No hiking to the “Knob” after 7pm. The trails can be extremely dangerous to the inexperienced hiker and young children. Also, if you hike to the “Knob” at any time during the day, and you are not on a scheduled hike with others, you should tell your Cubmaster or Camp Director.
- Respect all sizes of wildlife.
- No playing around the campfire. Serious injuries can occur. Never leave a fire unattended.
- We recommend that radios, CD players, electronic games and other electronic devices be left at home. The Parent-Cub Weekend is an outdoor experience and these items are not appropriate for this event.
- Package all your snacks in plastic bins. Animals have no problem chewing through a tent to get your snacks!

Helpful Hints for Scouts and Parents

- Events planned around the theme will take place in the camp program areas on Saturday. Arrive on Friday for the full Parent-Cub Weekend experience.
- Hiking opportunities are usually included as part of the activities so bring hiking boots and proper socks.
- A visit to the Raven Knob Museum should be on everyone's agenda!
- The Trading Post will be open during camp for those that have forgotten needed items or wish to purchase scout memorabilia.
- Wear comfortable closed toed shoes- no cros, Chaco's, sandals, flip flops, etc.!
- Bring rain gear.
- Pack snacks in airtight containers and be sure to bring plenty of water.
- Be sure to bring your fishing pole, tackle box, and live bait. Catch and Release only.
- A lot of great photo opportunities occur at Raven Knob, so be sure to bring a camera!
- Bring a first aid kit for that small scratch. The Health Lodge is the place to go for bigger emergencies.
- Always use the buddy system and never go hiking alone or when the trails are dark.
- Be prepared for warm or cold weather by dressing in layers. While it may be sunny during the day and comfortable, the night or early morning can be chilly.
- Bring sunscreen and insect repellent.
- Trail mix is great for a snack in between meals and fits easily in your shorts pockets or in a small backpack.
- Wildlife was here before us, so please respect all animals.
- Always go hiking with buddies and never go without an adult.
- S'mores and marshmallows are always a hit at the Pack campfire!
- Do not run or horseplay around any campfire and always keep a safe distance.
- Be sure to talk to new Scouts and new Packs. Make them feel at home!
